- 9. **Network vigorously.** Take every opportunity to network. Let people know what kind of position you're seeking. Attend industry events and follow up on promising leads.
- 10. **Be honest.** It's wise to make the most of your accomplishments, but avoid exaggerating. Mistakes can be costly.
- 11. **Be willing to start small.** Aim to get your foot in the door.
- 12. **Maintain a professional image.** Dress for the next position you aspire to. **Ensure** your conversation and humor are appropriate for the company culture.
